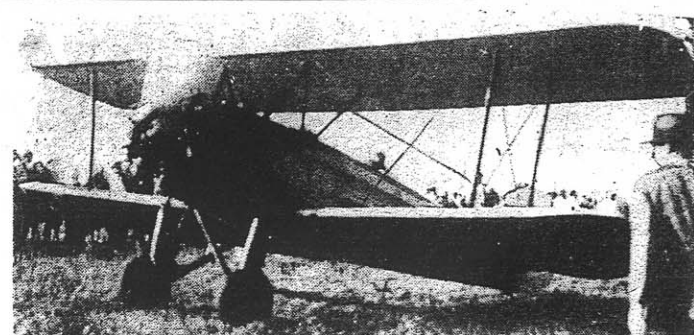
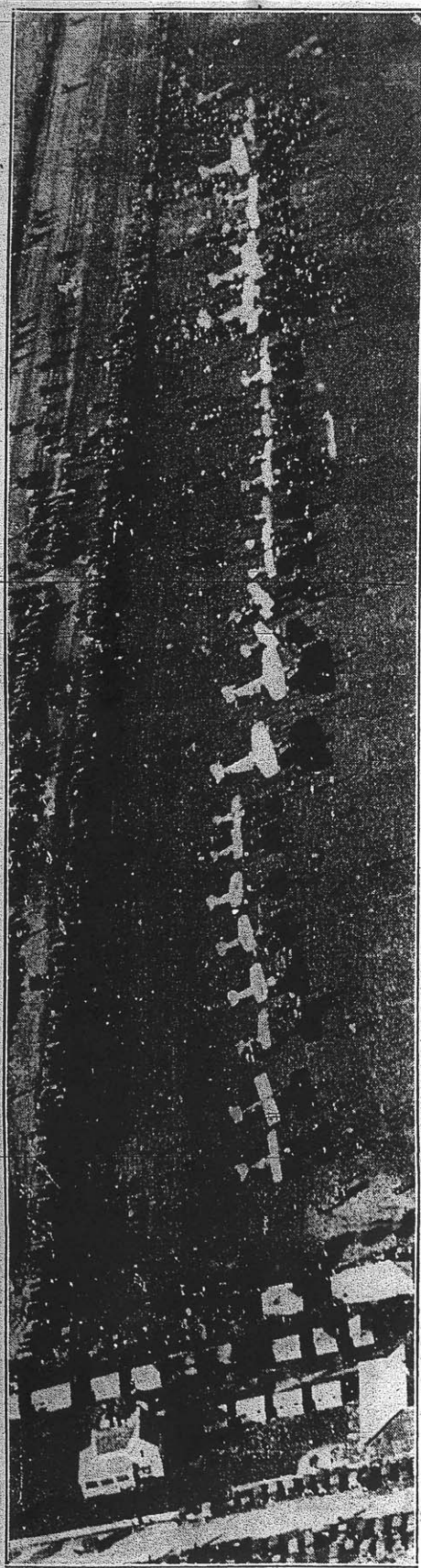

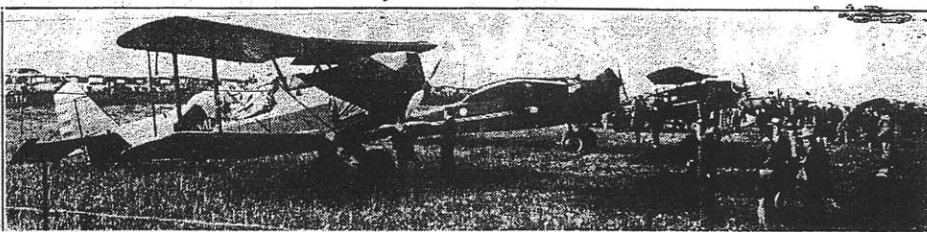


STILL LEADING.

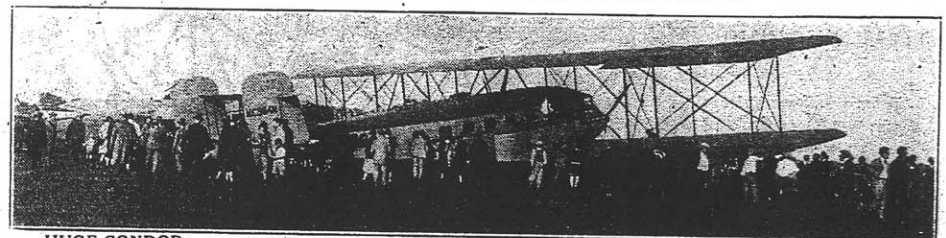

Mary Pickford and Douglas Fairbanks are enjoying a holiday at Baden-Baden, Germany. Mary is shown traveling in popular style of the town.

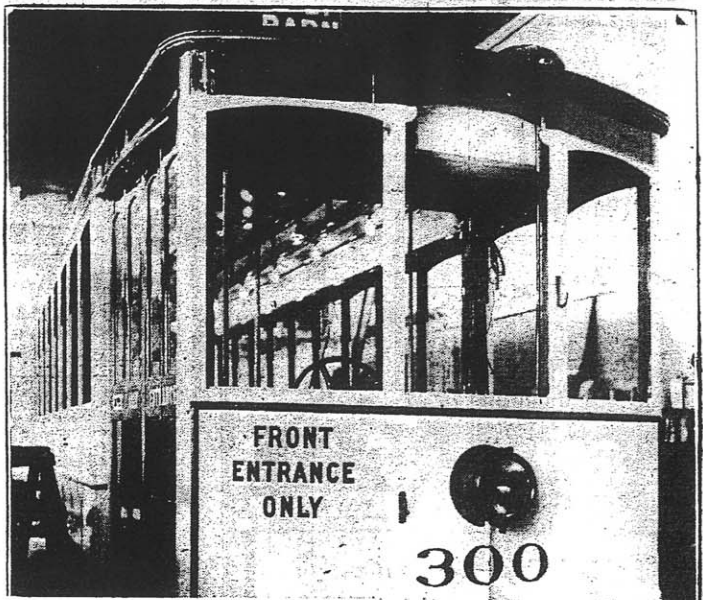


HUGE CONDOR.

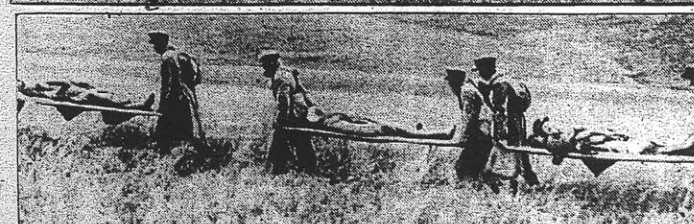
THIS IS FIRST ONE MAN STREET CAR BROUGHT TO DES MOINES.
