LOS ANGELES, July 13 -Public interest in this year's National Air Tour has far surpassed the three preceding tours in all of the 13 cities visited thus far by the fleet of planes in the annual reliability competition for the Edsel Ford Trophy, but Los Angeles bids fair to outstrip all others if attendance is to be taken as a criterion.

Fully 40,000 persons were on the field when the planes landed here from San Diego late yesterday, and 80,000 more were expected to examine the planes in the one-day layover here today. When the tour pathfinding party

landed here a month ago there was comparatively little interest at first and Ray Cooper, tour manager for the Detroit Board of Commerce sponsor of the event, considered scheduling the contest in Culver City for today.

The tour had never come to the Pacific Coast before and Los Angeles did not know its importance in aircraft development until it was scheduled and advertised," explained J. L. Maddux, Los Angeles representative of the Ford Motor Co., who was instrumental in bringing the tour here and is general chairman of the local committee.

"Before the planes leave here for San Francisco 120,000 persons will have been out to see them."

Interest here seems to run through the whole rank and file of the citi zenry. Several industrial plants were to be closed part of today so workers could see the planes, which include 23 of the aircraft industry's newest models, built by 12 of the foremost commercial aircraft manufacturers in the United States.
